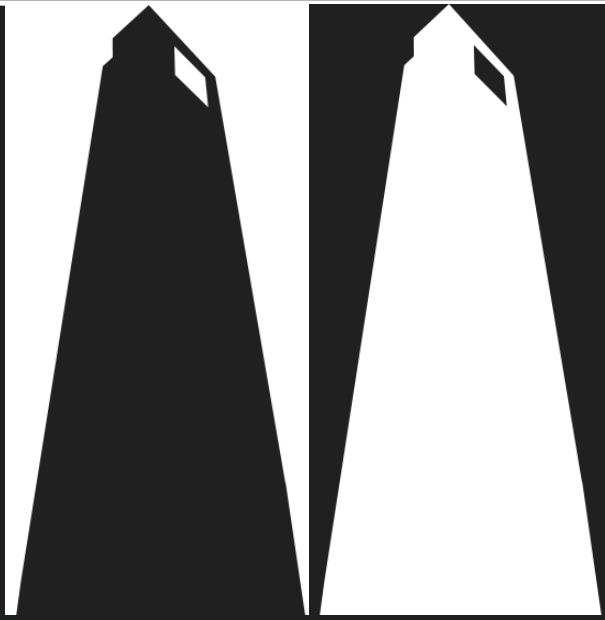


RETURNING CITIZENS ARE PEOPLE

200,000 lbs recycled → 11 jobs created → 0-percent recidivism
(from cities, schools, and businesses since 2015) (\$10/hr starting wage) (Statistically, 65.5%, or 7 people, would have recidivated.)
